Why we want you

The Pharmacy department has a team of over 100 staff providing pharmacy services through team working and prioritising the needs of those we serve. Our Pharmacy Technicians provide a range of services in the Hospital's pharmacy and on a monthly basis this can include: dispensing in excess of 8000 inpatients prescriptions, over 5500 outpatients and discharge prescriptions; over 900 aseptic productions; medicines safety and final checking

You will be providing valuable support to the team by assisting the team with the timely distribution of medications to the wards (and the Discharge Lounge) to enable patients to return home or to their place of care. This role will assist the hospital with patient flow, freeing up beds for new patients entering for care.

Your support will free up Pharmacy staff to concentrate on more complex patient focussed tasks, helping them to dispense quicker and improve flow through the department.

What you will be doing

- Delivering, by hand, medicines to specific wards and the Discharge Lounge for patients waiting to be discharged. All medicines will be sealed in green Pharmacy bags, red bags for Controlled Drugs or yellow bags for drugs which need to be kept in the fridge, labelled for specific wards
- Liaise with Nursing staff in order for them to receive and sign for pharmaceutical deliveries

The skills you need

- Physically fit to mobilise across the hospital site
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Friendly, confident and approachable manner
- · Good attention to detail
- Available to volunteer for a minimum of 3 hours a week
- Committed to the values of the Trust, including Data Protection and Equal Opportunities
- The ability to work independently whilst staying within the role's boundaries, recognising what should and should not be done, when to



seek advice or report concerns
